

NAGPRA Director #2019-49 (STROUD) Oversees all program operations of the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act. Works with other Sac and Fox tribes as well as tribes connected to the lands in question to identify and repatriate human remains, funerary objects, sacred objects, and objects of cultural patrimony with which they are culturally affiliated. Thorough knowledge of the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act. Identifies, contacts, and consults with museums, institutions, and agencies holding culturally unidentifiable human remains and associated funerary objects from the state of Missouri for the purpose of discussing and reaching agreements regarding disposition and/or repatriation as outlined in the Historical and Aboriginal Tribes of Missouri MOA. Conducts monthly meetings with the Sac and Fox Repatriation Committee to review completed files. Writes articles for the Sac and Fox Newspaper. Develops guidelines and policies for the Nation, established by the repatriation committee. Must possess basic knowledge of the existing elements of Sac and Fox history and specific knowledge of NAGPRA. Must possess basic knowledge of genealogy and archives and how to access materials from other sources. Must have ability to understand and manage the various financial aspects of the project grant. BS Degree or Education Equivalent, plus two (2) years' experience in repatriation preferred.
