earn FREE college tuition it's Oklahoma's Promise

With Oklahoma's Promise, the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program, 8th, 9th and 10th grade students whose annual family income is \$50,000 or less can earn FREE COLLEGE TUITION.

WHO MAY APPLY

- To enroll in Oklahoma's Promise, you must:
- Be an Oklahoma resident.
 - Apply during your 8th, 9th, or 10th-grade year (homeschool students must apply while age 13, 14 or 15).
 - Be the child of parents who earn \$50,000 or less per year at the time of application.
 - Read and understand the requirements of the program as listed on back.

THE BENEFITS

Once you've completed the program's high school requirements and meet the college requirements, Oklahoma's Promise can help pay your tuition at an Oklahoma public two-year college or four-year university. It will also cover a portion of tuition at an accredited private college or university or for Oklahoma public technology center courses that qualify for credit from a public two-year college. (The Oklahoma's Promise scholarship does not cover items such as other required fees, books, supplies, or room and board.)
