

55th Anniversary of Social Security and the 25th anniversary of Medicare

This is a partial reprint of a letter received by Thelma Coker of Seminole from the son of President Roosevelt, James Roosevelt, and Chairman National Committee to Preserve Social Security and Medicare, submitted by Dora Young.

On August 14, 1935, my father signed the Social Security Act into law.

Since you are a member of the National Committee to reserve Social Security and Medicare, I want you to have this enclosed photograph of my father signing the act to commemorate this historic event. I hope you will treasure it just as I do.

This year marks the 55th anniversary of Social Security and the 25th anniversary of Medicare.

We should have great cause to celebrate these important anniversaries because of the tremendous benefits, which Social Security and Medicare have provided to millions of older Americans.

But I am afraid that unless we take immediate action there will be far less left of Social Security and Medicare to celebrate.

Because the threats to Social Security and Medicare benefits are growing, we must remind the nation, and elected representatives in Washington, that Social Security and Medicare represent a solemn commitment to those who have contributed a lifetime of honest labor towards the building of our great country.

On the third anniversary of Social Security, my father went on the radio to remind the nation of the conditions that existed before Social Security.

He said, "Millions of people were living in wastelands of want and fear. Men and women too infirm to work either depended on those who had but little to share or spent their reaming years in the walls of a

poorhouse."

We must take action now to prevent any reduction in benefits in this great program.

Dora Young states, "As his son pointed out, President Roosevelt stated upon signing that "Millions of people were living in wastelands of want and fear. Men and women too infirm to work either depended on those who had but little to share or spent their reaming years in the walls of a poorhouse."

Throughout the years, and in attempting to cover up their own unlawful and wasteful spending on unneeded pork barrel projects to win re-election, the U.S. Congress have literally raided the Social Security Trust Fund instead of being careful stewards of U.S. tax dollars monies! They have almost wrecked this most needed and wonderful program that hard-working Americans have worked and contributed a lifetime of honest labor towards the building of this great country.

Johnson O'Malley Indian Education Seeking Committee Members

The Sac and Fox Nation is seeking persons interested in serving on the Indian Education Committee which administers the Nation's Johnson O'Malley Program. One (1) representative from each of the following districts is needed:

District #1: Agra, Cushing, Ripley, Oak Grove

District #2: Chandler, Meeker, Davenport, Prague, Stroud

District #3: Shawnee, Pleasant Grove, Grove, North Rock Creek

Representatives can be a parent, grandparent or legal guardian of a Native American student enrolled in the Johnson O'Malley Program, a person acting for or on behalf of the best interests of Native American children in the community, or an interested and concerned Native American community member who is familiar with education and has demonstrated leadership and involvement in the community. Representatives will be expected to be actively involved with school personnel in order to

understand and advocate for the needs of the students.

The purpose of the Committee is to: 1) Promote the welfare of Indian children and youth in home, school, community and Tribe; 2) Raise the standards of school achievement of Indian children; and 3) Bring into closer relationship the home and the school so that parents and teachers may cooperate intelligently in the education of Indian children and youth. Representatives will provide positive input and advocate progressive, innovative ideas to promote the betterment of the Johnson O'Malley Program purposes and will attend meetings on a regular basis.

This is a fresh start for the committee and all persons interested in serving are encouraged to submit a letter of interest to serve to the Tribal Secretary at the following address:
