

# Enjoy One of Oklahoma's County Fairs

Is a blue ribbon growing in your garden? A prize-worthy cucumber, squash or pepper may be ripening in your backyard just waiting for a chance to be exhibited at one of Oklahoma's county fairs. Educating farmers was the goal of fairs in the early 1800's, but anyone can exhibit produce, flowers or baked goods now. In fact, there is a vast array of categories that didn't exist when county fairs began. Handmade and homegrown items may include everything from jams and jellies to digital photography.

Livestock exhibits remain a popular element of each county fair. Students in FFA and 4-H programs exhibit animals they have raised and cared for including swine, cattle, goats, sheep, poultry and rabbits. Many urban residents look forward to this annual opportunity to meet farmers and ranchers and learn first-hand about animals important to our state's economy. The Harper County Fair in the panhandle offers a special exhibit of horsemanship and the Cleveland County

Free Fair in Norman stages a celebrity cow-milking contest and a goat roping contest.

#### TRIBAL EDUCATION (RAP) PROGRAMS

The Sac and Fox Nation Education Department would like to make all tribal members aware of the programs we offer. These programs are funded with Revenue Allocation Plan funds and are available to Sac and Fox Nation tribal members only. All awards are based on the availability of funds.

#### School Clothing/Supplies Grant

Funds are provided to assist Sac and Fox Nation school-aged (Pre-K through 12<sup>th</sup> grade) tribal members in obtaining adequate and appropriate school clothing and school supplies. Each eligible student will receive a check in the amount of \$200.00 for clothing and \$50.00 for school supplies until funds are depleted. Applicants may only apply one time per school year. Funding is on a first-come, first-served basis. Applications may be turned in beginning June 1<sup>st</sup> until September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2013, or until funds are depleted.

#### 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Incentive

Funds are provided to encourage Sac and Fox Nation tribal members to complete their education and to strive for excellence. All Sac and Fox Nation tribal members who have successfully completed the 8<sup>th</sup> grade in the current year are eligible to apply and will receive \$100.00 in incentive funds. Verification of completion must accompany application. Applications will be accepted until funding is depleted.

#### 12<sup>th</sup> Grade/GED Incentive

Funds are provided to encourage Sac and Fox Nation tribal members to complete their education and to strive for excellence. All Sac and Fox Nation tribal members who have successfully completed the 12<sup>th</sup> grade or who have successfully obtained their GED in the current year are eligible to apply and will receive \$200.00 in incentive funds. Verification of completion must accompany the application. Funding is on a first-come, first-served basis, and will continue until funds are depleted.

#### 12<sup>th</sup> Grade Graduation Grant

Funds are provided to assist Sac and Fox Nation high school senior tribal members to acquire the following: class ring, senior pictures, graduation cap and gown, and graduation announcements. All Sac and Fox Nation tribal members who are currently enrolled in the 12<sup>th</sup> grade may participate in this program. Each eligible student may receive up to \$500.00 in assistance, with the completed application and the vendor's invoice submitted. The funds will be paid directly to the vendors. Funding is on a first-come, first-served basis, until funds are depleted.

#### Degree/Certification Incentive

Funds are provided to encourage Sac and Fox Nation tribal members to complete their education and to strive for excellence. All Sac and Fox Nation tribal members who have successfully completed a post-secondary degree or adult vocational training certification in the current year may participate in this program. Incentive funds in the amount of \$1,000.00 will be awarded for post-secondary degrees and incentive funds in the amount of \$750.00 will be awarded for adult vocational training certifications.
