

## Black Hawk Health Center Contract Health Services Eye and Dental Program/Diabetic Eye and Dental program

Just a friendly reminder, routine eye exam and frames, lenses, or contact lenses are a service provided every two years. Patients are eligible for \$200.00 towards eye exam and frames, lenses or contacts. In the instance of broken or lost frames, lenses or contact lenses which may occur before the patient is eligible again, CHS will not be responsible for replacement.

The Dental program runs on a fiscal year; the fiscal year begins on October 1st and ends September 30th. Patients are eligible for \$1200.00 per fiscal year. Dentures and partials are eligible for replacement every two years.

The Diabetic eye program runs on a calendar year, the calendar year begins January 1st and ends December 31st. Diabetic patients are eligible for a diabetic eye

exam every year, but are allowed glasses every two years. Patients are eligible for \$250.00 towards frames, lenses or contact lenses.

The Diabetic dental program runs on a calendar year; the calendar year begins January 1st and ends December 31st. Diabetic patients are eligible for \$1200.00 per calendar year. Dentures and partials are eligible for replacement every two years.

ALL programs require patients to have an approved referral prior to receiving services.

The Sac and Fox Nation is seeking persons interested in serving on the Indian Education Committee which administers the Nation's Johnson O'Malley Program. One (1) representative from each of the following districts is needed:

District #1: Agra, Cushing, Ripley, Oak Grove

District #2: Chandler, Meeker, Davenport, Prague, Stroud

District #3: Shawnee, Pleasant Grove, Grove, North Rock Creek

Representatives can be a parent, grandparent or legal guardian of a Native American student enrolled in the Johnson O'Malley Program, a person acting for or on behalf of the best interests of Native American children in the community, or an interested and concerned Native American community member who is familiar with education and has demonstrated leadership and involvement in the community. Representatives will be expected to be actively involved with school personnel in order to understand and advocate for the

needs of the students.

The purpose of the Committee is to:

1) Promote the welfare of Indian children and youth in home, school, community and Tribe; 2) Raise the standards of school achievement of Indian children; and 3) Bring into closer relationship the home and the school so that parents and teachers may cooperate intelligently in the education of Indian children and youth. Representatives will provide positive input and advocate progressive, innovative ideas to promote the betterment of the Johnson O'Malley Program purposes and will attend meetings on a regular basis.

## NATIVE AMERICAN FILM FESTIVAL HELD AT OU BEGINNING FEB. 7

NORMAN – Native youth and family issues are the focus of indigenous feature, short, animated and documentary films to be screened at the inaugural Native Crossroads Film Festival. The festival will couple screenings with roundtable discussions intended to inspire conversations among filmmakers, scholars, community and tribal network members, writers and performers.

First Circle, a documentary about the foster care system from producer Randy Redroad and director Heather Rae, both Cherokee, is the featured film; it will show at 7:30 p.m. Friday, Feb. 8, in the Kerr Auditorium of the Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History, 2401 Chautauqua Ave.

Up Heartbreak Hill, 7 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 7, Kerr Auditorium, Sam Noble Museum. A documentary about Navajo track stars faced with the dilemma of staying with home and family or leaving the reservation for greater possibilities.

Richard van Camp (Dogrib) workshop/reading with elementary-age school children, Meacham Auditorium, introduced by Kristin Dowell, 10 a.m. Friday, Feb. 8, Meacham Auditorium, Oklahoma Memorial Union, 900 Asp Ave. van Camp is the author of several books for children and producer of the film The Lesser Blessed.

Other films and discussions will showcase indigenous language animations and explore challenges facing Native teens in urban environments.


