Also survived by his grandmothers Lena Clark of Shawnee, OK and Lila Sage of Sacramento; his Aunts Helen (Henry) Perkins MI, Audrey Stryker OH, Bev Seale WV, Marilyn Galano (Bob) NM/Stockton and JuliAnne (Mike) Rhine of Tracy.
