

Columbia Marie Haupt, 16 Year Old Sac and Fox Tribal Member Makes History With High School Fast Pitch Team

Columbia Marie Haupt, a 16 year old sophomore and Sac & Fox tribal member, made history with her high school fast pitch team. Columbia is the daughter of Shelley McKosato-Haupt (Sac & Fox) and John Haupt (Makah). She is the granddaughter of the late Hoke Mack McKosato (Sac & Fox) and Bette Free-McKosato (Iowa Tribe) of Perkins. She lives in Sequim, Washington where she plays right field and pitches for her high school softball team.

This year the Sequim Wolves made history by going undefeated in the regular season, in districts and in the state tournament leaving the 2011 season at 28-0. No other Sequim softball team has accomplished such a record. Columbia started on the mound a few times this year and picked up wins everytime.

Besides being the 2011 District Champs and carrying a record of 22-0, they were the top seed in the Class 2A State Tournament. No other Sequim team, boys or girls, have

ever won a state championship in any major sport.

May 14th, the Sequim High fastpitch squad took down two more opponents in the sub-district tournament in Enumclaw, WA. They clobbered the White River Hornets 9-4 and pounded the Franklin Pierce Cardinals 9-0. These teams were the top two teams from the South Puget Sound League. Columbia contributed big hits in both games to bring victory to the Wolves.

Winning the sub-district tournament gave Sequim the top seed heading into the West Central District Tournament held in Tacoma, WA, May 20-21st. During this Class 2A bi-district play, the Lady Wolves blasted the Kingston Buccaneers 10-0; pounded rivals Port Angeles RoughRiders 15-4; and aced out the White River Hornets 12-0.

Columbia played right field in all three games while pounding the ball for one homerun, 9 RBI's, and scoring 4 times.

Sequim advanced to the Class 2A State Tournament in Selah, Washington where they played at Carlon Park on May 27-28.

The Lady Wolves played their first round Friday the 27th at 10 am against the Lynden Lions. They won their opener 12-10 then took on the Othello Huskies in the quarterfinals, where they cracked six homeruns beating them 14-7.

Saturday morning the Lady Wolves took on their toughest opponent of the year, the Anacortes Seahawks in the semifinals but held on to their perfect record by winning 8-7.

They entered the championship game with nothing on their mind but to make history and win state! The Lady Wolves scored first against the Ellensburg Bulldogs after two Wolves got on and then a huge double by Columbia. Ellensburg tied it up in the fourth inning but couldn't hold on as Sequim scored in the seventh inning, winning the championship game 2-1 and taking the state title.

The 28-0 Lady Wolves were strong throughout their entire season, 10-running teams all year with their deadly lineup of long-ball hitters from top to bottom and stopping anything and everything with their stellar defense.

Sequim had nine players make the Olympic All-League Team; Columbia was on that list as an outfielder. Sequim also had the MVP of the league on their team.
