RAP Department Tribal Energy



The Tribal Energy Program has more funds. Funds will be used to pay electric bills until September 30, 2011 or funds run out. Funding for this program is limited and each application will be processed in the order in which it was received. We are currently in the cooling season and will provide for electric needs only.

Applicant must submit a completed RAP Department Application for Assistance and attach a copy of the electric bill they are requesting assistance with. A household may receive up to \$500.00 per fiscal year for energy needs. A fiscal year runs from October 1 to September 30. A tribal member may submit more than one request, until such time as the household reaches the \$500 limit, provided funding is available. After eligibility is determined, payment will be made directly to vendors.
